Respondent George Benjamin Selby LPC, was the subject of a complaint in which it was alleged that he violated several provisions of the ACA Code of Ethics. Respondent acknowledged that he did in fact engage in behaviors which violated the Code. Counsel for the Board and Respondent, having discussed the matters at issue in this case with each other and Counsel for the Board with her client; and it further appearing that it would serve the ends of justice that a Consent Order be entered which will resolve this matter, and to that end, with the consent of all parties, the Board hereby enters the following Order:

IT IS, BY CONSENT, HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED;

- 1. Respondent's license is suspended as of March 7, 2008.
- 2. Respondent will submit to the Board within 30 days of the date of this order an assessment and a comprehensive treatment plan to address long term and short term treatment.
- 3. Respondent will authorize his treatment provider to sent the Board a report every three months for a period of one year.
- 4. Respondent's treatment provider will report to the Board Respondent's adherence to his treatment plan. Once Respondent has a documented period of sobriety for six months, Respondent will be moved to probationary status. His probationary status will last for 12 months.

- 5 Respondent will practice under supervision by a Board Approved Supervisor for a period of 12 months of probation.
 - 6. Respondent shall maintain all required CEU's for licensure.
 - 7. Respondent shall abide by the ACA Code of Ethics.
- 8. Failure of Respondent to abide by the terms of this agreement can be grounds for further disciplinary action by the Board upon a showing of probable cause and due notice to Respondent.
